

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely, and then Senator Higgins.

SENATOR WESELY: Question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote promptly. We're voting to cease debate. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Debate has ceased. Senator Haberman, would you like to close please.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes, Mr. President, thank you. Members of the body, I have a confession to make. I made an error. It's been called to my attention. It's not going to cost you \$7 million, it's only going to cost \$4,182,000, so I make...apclogize for making that small mistake of \$3 million. Now my good friend, Senator Remmers, over here got up and boy he thundered on we've got to save those bones, we've got to save them bones because they are deteriorating. Fine, I want to save the bones. But back in 1982, Senator Remmers, it only cost \$20,000 to save the bones, to put in an air control system at Morrill Hall. That is what they said, to save them bones would cost \$20,000. Now all of a sudden to save the bones it is 130,000 how to plan to save them, and then it is \$4 million to keep on saving them, and that isn't even buying any more bones. That is the same old bones. Now we could stop a lot of this if we'd charge admission to everybody except school children. You go to Joslyn Museum in Omaha they charge an admission. I'm not against them old bones. I want to save them too. But I doubt if you count them, at \$4 million apiece, how many bones and divided in there, they are awful expensive. I think we can save it and delay it a year. I've got a feeling in my stomach I haven't got the votes, Mr. President, so I won't have a call of the house, but we'll take a machine vote and see what happens.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Haberman amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 3 ayes, 14 nays on adoption of the amendment.
