

Senator Carsten. I think we should vote on it. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion on the challenge? Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Speaker, before the vote is taken, I would like to have you know that Senator Cal Carsten probably has an inkling of what I was about to say. I doubt very much that he will want to have said out loud what will be presented to you in writing, so I will withdraw the opportunity to read it to you. I will allow you, if you have the courage, to read the resolution from this statewide conference of women of Nebraska. I will allow you to read the resolution to make your own decision about whether women's voices should be heard in the Legislature. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I changed my mind. I want to stay out of this.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this particular amendment is only a reappropriation of the unexpended balance that was appropriated in the deficiency bill that has been passed. It deals with asbestos removal at the School for the Deaf and the Nebraska School for the Visually Handicapped. As you know there is constant serious problem with people's health and asbestos. The money was appropriated in the deficiency bill in order to remove those asbestos walls or ceilings that might be in the building.
