

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I would move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to adopt the E & R amendments to 564. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment from Senators Hannibal and Landis.

PRESIDENT: Senators Hannibal and Landis available?

CLERK: Senator, this is your amendment on page 2130 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: This is an amendment, Senator Hannibal, to LB 564. What was the page again?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. President, members, this is a friendly amendment to the bill. It is a technical amendment because the amendment was drafted originally, fairly quickly when we saw the fee structure was not going to fund the agency and we left out a date. I don't have it in front of me. It's friendly and it is technical. It doesn't change anything, just makes it all work out. Trust me.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on Senator Hannibal's amendment? All those in favor of the Hannibal...Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Yes, Senator Hannibal, could you explain that again. I'm sorry, I didn't hear that.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: When we drafted the amendment we originally started off with a bill that said a \$100 fee, this is for the abstractors, land surveyors? Land surveyors, raising the fee from \$50 to \$100. The committee, I believe, brought it out saying, no, we don't want to raise it quite that high. We want to raise it to 75. The cash flow figures show that it wouldn't work out over a two year period. So Senator Landis and I and the fiscal office got together and made the amendment that said we are going to raise it up to 75 this year and then 100 next year. But we omitted what happened after next year. We said it was this year 75, 100 next year, and then according to the way the
