SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body, the purpose of this amendment to the bill is to provide 59 land surveyors can have just one more year to meet their continuing education requirement. So, on page 1, line 5, we just strike 1986 and put in 1987. That is the sum and substance of the amendment. The land surveyors, there are 59 of them that got caught in this position. They come from Imperial, West Point, two of them from Ord, two from Grand Island, four from North Platte, two from Sioux City, Silver Creek, Wahoo has a couple, Chadron, Overton, Kearney, Broken Bow, Tekamah, Loup City, Bridgeport, Beatrice and on and on.
