

year? Do we postpone it two years and put ourselves back in the soup two years from now? Or do we repeal it? Now Senator Lynch pointed out that this year in Douglas County, 85 or 90 percent of the people have applied for the homestead exemption and that LB 809 has imposed a \$150,000 in cost on Douglas County alone. Now are we going to postpone it one year to make sure that those costs are all imposed on the counties once again, and then next year, as Senator Warner points out, be in the kind of revenue position where we are very unlikely to fund it next year? I mean if we simply postpone it a year, we are compounding the problem. We are making another promise that we will probably default on again. It just doesn't make sense. As Senator Warner points out, if we want to fund it next year and have the funds available next year, then we can repass the act, but to leave the situation in this state of limbo to set ourselves up for one more breach of promise, one more imposition of hundreds of thousands of dollars on the counties to process this paperwork recycling program just doesn't make sense. I think the sensible thing to do is to convert this into a repealer or to fund it. We know we are not going to fund it so let's repeal it. I would ask the adoption of this amendment. Thank you.
