

time to read them again but for Senator Nelson and Senator Pappas and some of the others, what was good last night is good this morning. Thank you, Mr. President. I ask you to support the bracket.

PRESIDENT: There are no other recognition lights on. The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb to close on his motion to bracket. (Gavel ) Order, please.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the body, this is a legitimate motion to do what I think needs to be done at this point. Sure, I recognize that we probably won't have an override opportunity, but that doesn't bother me and I don't think it bothers any of the rest of you. I don't think there will be any overrides. What it does, it brings to a head the fact that some people in this body made an agreement yesterday, people made an agreement here that if they would have one more chance then they would not do it again. There was an agreement back there, fallen apart now. Got what they wanted. They got their vote. But now that they got what they got, their part of the deal, then they are going back and they are going to try it again and again and again. And I think Senator Warner is correct. We will debate it all the rest of today. Then we will be back Monday. We will be debating the bill again. Many of us can use the rules. Senator Chambers is an expert at using the rules and he does it very well. And you have seen some of his efforts in the last few days. But he is not the only one that can use the rules. Some of the rest of us know the rules well enough to use them and we can. Now LB 662, as you know, is a bill that is very important to me, but I did not use the rules. I did not delay that bill. I did not have a hundred amendments on that bill. I could have had...I could have had a lot of amendments on that bill. Senator Beutler is smiling. He thinks I used the rules. I didn't use the rules. I know how to use the rules a lot better than I used the rules, if I used the rules, but I didn't use the rules. I could have used them a lot better. I have got some more amendments here I could put on this bill too, you know, priority amendments. It's not hard. Senator Chambers has demonstrated how easy it is, you know, priority motions are easy. Somebody commented to me yesterday, somebody that's had experience in the federal Congress says, this place, you can tie it up a lot easier than you can Congress and I believe it and we can do it. But I don't want to do that,
