Mr. President, the next motion I have on 722 is offered by Senator Wesely. Senator Wesely would move to return the bill for a specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, I understand, Senator Hefner, but let me go ahead if you don't mind. Thank you. Mr. President and members, it is obvious from the last vote the point is hopeless to carry this on any further. I thought some people had made some commitments they obviously don't keep it. That is nothing new around this legislative body, so I am going to ask that this be withdrawn.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn...or the motion is withdrawn. Next.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is offered by Senator Goodrich. Senator Goodrich would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 8; Rule 7, Section 3, to prohibit further amendment or motions to LB 722.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President and members of the body. The rule speaks for itself. This is a decision you have to make as to whether you want to do anything further on this bill. If you don't want to do anything further on the bill, adopt this motion, we suspend the rules and we push the bill forward and forget it for the day.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, there is no way that I can say that my way of doing things is the way other people would do things. But there is no way that I would participate in the drafting of an amendment in which I had a deep interest and after that amendment was dealt with, make a motion to prevent anybody else from offering an amendment or discussing the bill
