In the rough and tumble of the last few minutes of the last few days, it becomes difficult, so these items that were in that package ought to be taken one at a time, as difficult as that may seem. But because the arguments have been given already, the amount of debate can be kept to a minimum and these individual items can be voted on. I know of some people, at least one person, who didn't vote on the last package, who does have a deep interest in one of those commissions and I am led to understand that those amendments, the individual consideration of each commission, those amendments have not been withdrawn. So I am saying all this to say that I am opposed to Senator Goodrich's motion and I wish he would do the decent thing and withdraw it and give others the opportunity that he was just accorded on the last vote.

And so all this does is bracket it because, by the way, it just got read in, it's been advanced to Final now. It has gone through E & R, right? It has, hasn't it? Yeah, it's on...pardon?
