

Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Wait a minute. Hello, are we on? Okay, Senator Higgins, I put that bracket motion up on this bill yesterday. There was no conversation between you and I or anywhere else...between me and anyone else regarding the homemakers motion. I am perfectly willing to withdraw that motion right now but that has been superseded by the motion to bracket so consequently I had nothing to do with it.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Senator Goodrich. All I can do then, senators, is ask you, those of you who are interested in any further amendments on the bill, and I don't even know how many they have up there. I only know one, Senator Hall's, to put the displaced homemaker at least in the same league as college kids learning to play baseball and basketball and football, and that is all I am asking for, give a woman a chance as much as you give a college student a chance to play games.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR HIGGINS: So I am asking you to vote against Senator DeCamp's motion to bracket and vote for the opportunity to present the amendment for the displaced homemaker. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall and then Senator Chambers and Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President and members, I would urge the body to reject the DeCamp motion to bracket. I think that we spent a lot of time on this bill, but that is not unusual. We spend a lot of time doing a lot of things. I think that there is a lot of good amendments up there that probably need to be looked at. Some of them have been posed before and they may yet be posed again. I question why Senator DeCamp picked Tuesday. He has changed his bracket motion from Tuesday to Monday. And, Senator, could you elaborate on that?

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes. I will make no secret. My intent is exactly as Senator Higgins believes and as I stated. I want to lock the bill in its present form and remove the
