It is the last opportunity and I hope that you will defeat Senator DeCamp's motion, then allow Senator Goodrich the opportunity to withdraw his and we can proceed.

PRESIDENT: May we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Call the question.

PRESIDENT: Do I see five seconds? I do. I will put the question to you. Shall the debate cease on the motion to bracket? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no.
