We will break for lunch this noon. We will not break for dinner tonight, if it takes that long, and you will notice under number eight, number eight, towards the bottom of your sheet, "Motions to Return". If you return 722, 717 and bills like that, then is when you will do that. At the time we prepared the agenda, last Friday, I was assuming, and optimistic that 722 would be handled that day in its entirety and no amending would be necessary so I didn't put it on the agenda. But, if anyone wishes to bring back 722 that is the time to do it, number eight on your agenda. So please read this, if you have questions let me know, but it should be self-explanatory.
