PRESIDENT: Very well. Question is, shall the house come under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays, to go under call.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries, the house is under call. All members now in your seats please look up to the front board and put on your green light. Members in your seats please put on your green light. Members outside the Chamber, please be informed that the house is under call. You are asked to come to the Chamber and record your presence. Two members are excused at the present time. Senator Beyer and Senator Vickers, Senator Beutler, Senator Chambers, Senator Hoagland, Senator Rogers, Senator Landis, Senator Lynch, please, Senator Hefner. Senator Beutler, Senator Hoagland, Senator Landis, Senator Hefner. Senator Hoagland, Senator Landis and Senator Hefner please come to the Chamber, the house is under call. Senator Hoagland and...is here, Senator Landis and Senator Hefner, the house is under call please. Senator Hefner. All are here who are not excused. A roll call vote in reverse order has been requested and the question is, the adoption of the Barrett amendment to the Hall-DeCamp amendment to LB 157. Please members, please tone down your conversation so the Clerk may hear your vote. Roll call vote in reverse order, proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. Vote appears on pages 2616-17 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Now we are back to the Hall-DeCamp amendment. Correct, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I have nothing further on that amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the Hall-DeCamp amendment? Care to close, Senator DeCamp?

SENATOR DECAMP: I'll take two and a half minutes and give Senator Hall two and a half minutes, is that okay? So you know what you are voting on, we have tried to combine in one amendment all the various things discussed. It strikes all original sections. Both prejudgment and postjudgment interest will be set at one percent above the T-bill rate,
