My amendments are designed to tighten up certain areas that I thought were necessary, for example, conveyance, meaning a vehicle of one kind or another can be utilized in an official role by the confiscating agency and I simply gave a definition of official use to make sure that it couldn't be used for purpose other than that envisioned by the bill.

SENATOR HALL: So, in other words somebody couldn't drive it back and forth to lunch?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well they can, but they aren't supposed to...

SENATOR HALL: They could use it for undercover but they couldn't use it for personal use, those types of things.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, and the others are along that line. There are about two others and I don't even remember
