

PRESIDENT: Question has been called. Do I see five hands, seconding hands? I don't see five seconding hands. I do now. Put the question to you. CLERK: No, I'm fine, Mr. President. Next motion to have is by Senator Johnson, this is your one percent, Senator.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: ...I said I will withdraw that and I will withdraw that particular amendment.

PRESIDENT: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator Warner, I now have your amendment, Senator.
