PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Question.

PRESIDENT: Question has been called for. There are other lights on. Do I see five seconding hands? I do. The question is shall the debate cease. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. You are voting to cease debate on the Warner amendment to LB 539. Please record your vote. Twenty-five votes required, members. May we have your attention. May we have the membership's attention to the motion on the floor. Do you wish to cease debate on the Warner amendment to 539. If you do, please record your vote so that we may proceed. The Chair will allow 20 seconds for recording your vote to cease debate, please, so we can move along. Motion is to cease debate on the Warner motion on 539. Please record your vote. Ten seconds. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.
