

SENATOR BEUTLER: I guess I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote then.

PRESIDENT: Very well. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Members in your seats, please look up to the front and turn on your green light showing your presence, please. Members outside the Chamber, please return to the Unicameral Chamber, the house is under call. Senator Harris, Senator Morehead, Vard Johnson, Senator Landis, Senator Haberman, Senator Rogers, Senator Chambers, Senator Morehead. Senator Schmit. Senator Landis, please. All members are present. May we have quiet in the Chamber, please. The motion is to indefinitely postpone 539 and a roll call vote has been requested. Proceed with the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 2634 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Are there other amendments to the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner would move to amend the bill. (Warner amendment appears on pages 2634-35 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Warner. The call of the house is raised. Thank you.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the amendment is the one percent income tax retroactive to January 1, 1985. It is not my intention in offering it that one opens up this year's budget to many multimillion dollars of appropriations.
