

Is the Speaker here?

PRESIDENT: That was not what the Speaker said last when he was up here. He set up LB 713 and then 127. Speaker Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, what was the question?

PRESIDENT: I guess we want to know what bill we're going to. I announced 713.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I signed a request as a member of the Business and Labor Committee and it was supposed to be given to the Speaker that we take 127 before 713.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I had it on the agenda as it shows. Request was made to take it off, I'm talking about 713. I took it off. A request was made to put it back on. I put it on. Another request was made to take it off. I took it off. A final request was to put it on. It's on, it's going to stay there. You change it if you want to, but I'm tired of changing it back and forth. Take it or bracket it or do whatever you want to, but I'm not going to change anymore. I think five days in one day is enough.

PRESIDENT: 713.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first motion I have is offered by 14 members. It is printed separately. It is AM1579. Senator DeCamp, I believe this is the one you turned into me, Senator.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, there was a secondary plot, planned program, to go with LB 127 and put possibly the video lottery concept in there. However, since the amendment is up there let's just vote on it. It puts video lottery into 713 and has a vote of the people and pays the Commonwealth people out of that.

PRESIDENT: Senator Sieck, you may lead off if you wish.

SENATOR SIECK: Yes, Mr. President, I would like to have a ruling on this whether it is germane to the original 713
