

CLERK: 25 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Debate is closed. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, the amendment up there is 61 pages long. I'd like to know how many people in this body know what's in the amendment. The amendment has the date of June 3 on it. The amendment is number 1629 which is a late one, AM1629 dated 6-3, which I think is today. I don't know whether that is the date it was requested but it's the date that it was delivered. Nobody in this body really knows what is in that amendment except some of the sponsors, I'm sure. So here we are down here at four fifty-six with two days left in the session, we are considering a very important amendment. It's essentially a bill which has been before this session all year. It was in committee for weeks and weeks and weeks. It's been out on the floor for quite some time. Now here what are we doing, right down here at the very end of the day? We're trying to attach this LB 144, the video slot bill onto another bill and LB 144 is still alive and kicking. It's not a dead bill. It could have been used. Now you talk about the integrity of this body. I think when the people out there in the state learn how this system is working they will not be enthralled, not at all. We should vote these issues up or down on their merits. If you think video slots are the way to go you should have voted for 144. Let's go that way. This is a reprehensible type of legislation. I don't think you really approve of it. I don't think anybody really approves of it. I think we should reconsider our action and vote this amendment down.
