CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a motion from Senator Vard Johnson. Senator, am I to understand that you want to withdraw your motion and substitute?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Johnson.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Johnson would move to suspend the rules and vote on LB 127, as amended, without further debate.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, I would like to get back to LB 713. I don't want to spend forever and a day on LB 127. I just think we ought to suspend the rules and do an up or down vote on the bill as amended. So I'm offering this motion to suspend the rules so we can at least have an up or down vote on LB 127.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator "Paragon" Vard...Senator Vard "Paragon" Johnson a question.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator "Paragon", Senator Johnson, do you favor LB 127?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: As amended, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you know it legalizes video lotteries?
