

don't vote for it. But let us at least have the opportunity to do our duty by voting on 127 by first suspending the rules. Once the rules are suspended we can vote on 127 and then we can deal with the more intractable, more difficult and the one issue, the one issue that justice requires be dealt with this session, the Commonwealth debacle.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to suspend the rules and to vote on LB 127. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The vote to suspend the rules requires 30 votes. Members, please record your vote. Motion is to suspend the rules to take up LB 127. Please record your vote if you wish to vote on this motion to suspend the rules. The Chair will allow 20 seconds for you to do so. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 14 nays on the motion to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. Now we're back to LB 127. I assume the motion is to advance the bill which is debatable...without debate, correct, very well. Thank heaven. (Laughter.) The motion is to advance LB 127 from Select File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. This is a motion to advance LB 127. Please record your vote. The Chair will allow 20 seconds. The motion is to advance. Please record. Ten. Roll call vote has been requested, very well. Go back to a mood of silence, members, so that your votes may be heard. Vote aye or nay, roll call vote. Record the roll, Mr. Clerk. Senator Pappas, what?

SENATOR PAPPAS: (Response inaudible.)

PRESIDENT: I believe all members are here. Senator Chambers is not here. Do you want to put us under call, Senator Pappas? Senator Chambers is the only man not here. The Clerk will proceed with the roll call vote.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2644 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill fails to advance. Senator Vard Johnson.
