

will cast a vote to give these 7,000 people a little something extra. Won't even bring them hardly up to a quarter on the dollar lost, but it is a little bit something. In Ohio they appropriated an extra \$100 million to see that the guaranty fund there was adequate. In Maryland they are doing something similar. In Nebraska we haven't done anything at all. We haven't even taken care of the depositors who have been hurt. So I hope that the \$4 million beyond the tort claim doesn't sound extravagant to you. It doesn't sound extravagant to me. I think it is quite appropriate. I hope you will vote for the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Question is the adoption of the Beutler amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please vote if you care to. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I'd ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The question is shall the house go under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor, which I think you have. Look up to see if your light is lit. Ladies and gentlemen, (gavel), ladies and gentlemen, please look up and see if your light is lit. I don't have your attention yet. Senator Sieck and Senator Labeledz. Senator Sieck is here. Was roll call vote requested, Senator Beutler? Okay. We are voting on the adoption of the Beutler amendment. Roll call vote is asked for. Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2650 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. Do you have anything else on it?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, the next series of amendments I have is offered by Senator Haberman.
