PRESIDENT: The call of the house is raised. Senator Hall, do you want to move to advance the bill.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I move that LB 713 be advanced from Select File to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 713 to Select...from Select File to E & R. All those in favor say aye...very well, a machine vote. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Nothing ventured, nothing gained. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 14 nays on the motion to advance LB 713, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced to E & R for Engrossment. Now then we go to 663. There is a priority motion on LB 127. Speaker Nichol, Speaker Nichol, is it okay to take up the priority motion on 127?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would move to reconsider the adoption of the Pappas amendment to LB 127.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I would hope that we could take just few minute. In the last hour I've discovered the evils of video lottery. I would like to strike that amendment from LB 127. They are a plague upon the land. Unless we take action here today to stop this sin, potential sin, by taking this amendment out of here, there are all kinds of terrible things that could happen. So I would ask that we reconsider and strike the Pappas amendment, and that we then advance the litter bill to Final Reading. I have no intentions of attempting anything else other than to strike the Pappas amendment. That is a promise. Trust me.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit. Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Very briefly, Mr. President. The litter bill did come through the Agriculture and Environment Committee. We do need the bill, as Senator DeCamp has indicated. I would urge the body to reject the Pappas
