LB 668, 718, 722

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is the return of the bill. Okay, we have been asked to check in so please indicate your presence by pushing your green light, please. Two are excused. Senator Labeledz, please, Carson Rogers, Senator Landis. Please turn off your speaking lights. It is easier to see up here. Thank you. And did you ask for a roll call vote? Okay, the question is the return of the bill. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Mr. Clerk. And Senator Higgins has requested reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken in reverse order. See pages 2675-76 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LB 718 and 668. Do you have anything else on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir, I do not.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, read the bill.

CLERK: (Read LB 722 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT MCGINLEY PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: We are ready to vote on LB 722. All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 722 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote if you wish to vote on passing LB 722 with the emergency clause attached. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. Malfunction.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2676-77 of the Legislative Journal.) 36 ayes, 11 nays, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: A sufficient number having voted in the affirmative, the bill is declared passed with the emergency clause attached. Someone have a motion? While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign, and do sign engrossed LB 722.
