PRESIDENT: LB 725 is declared pass with the emergency clause attached. LB 726 with the emergency clause.

CLERK: (Read LB 726 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 726 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 2682 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 6 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 728 (sic) is declared passed with the emergency clause attached, excuse me 726. We are now ready for 728.
