provides a prohibition against excessive honorariums, prohibitions against persons paid for work not done, prohibitions against the hiring of relatives, prohibitions against the solicitation of campaign funds from employees and limitations on the use of mass mailings during election periods. And finally then the last major provision of the bill provides for an enforcement mechanism which would be your Rules Committee. With that basic explanation, I am going to ask for a division of the question.

PRESIDENT: How do you want the question divided?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would wish, Mr. President, to have Sections 1, 2 and 3 of proposed Rule 9 in one division; paragraph 4 in a separate division; paragraphs 5, 6 and 7 together in a separate division; paragraph 8 in a separate division; paragraph 9 in a separate division and paragraph 10 in a separate division.

PRESIDENT: Is there objection or discussion on the question or division of the question? The Clerk would like to ask a point of clarification.

CLERK: Senator, would then...are there not...Sections 11 and 12, would they be part of that last division or are they a separate division?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, I'm sorry. Separate 11...yes, Section 11 and 12 would be the final division, Pat. Sorry.

CLERK: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barrett, did you wish to speak on the point?

SENATOR BARRETT: Mr. President, I would ask that Senator Beutler repeat the division again, please.

PRESIDENT: Would you do so, Senator?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, the first division would be Sections 1, 2 and 3 taken together. The next would be Section 4 considered separately. The next would be Sections 5, 6 and 7 considered together, then Section 8 considered separately; Section 9 considered separately; Section 10 considered separately; and Sections 11 and 12
