as high as it should be, that the public has concerns about this and that. If you would take the time, and I am sure some of you will, to check the polls that have gone on on state legislatures and governors for about the last 25 to 30 years that they have been keeping pretty good records, the Nebraska Legislature has consistently come out almost exactly the same place that all the other legislatures across the United States do. Whether you have the strict code of conduct or whether you have this or that special accountability commissions, legislatures are a composite, a composite of all the types of citizens that make up society from the lawyer who some think is the shyster to the real estate dealer who some think is the greatest person that ever was because he sings in the church choir, to others who think he is a hustler because he peddles real estate for far more than it's worth, but, by and large, the polls show this, and I don't have the exact numbers but it is pretty much like this. Our individual legislator, our Sammy or our John, or our Wiley or our Tom is the best one down there. He is one of the good ones. Now, the rest of them as a group are about mediocre to average but at least we got a good one and that is true whether it's Nebraska or Iowa or Colorado or New York. And overall I think just among ourselves those who have been here a while know this, and I think the press knows this, at least the members sitting up there that have been around here a while, if you were going to pick a "clean Legislature" if you wanted to use that word, I would have to guess the Nebraska Legislature, for whatever reason, maybe it's our Nebraskaness, our Unicameralness, or a thousand different things, is probably about as clean as any Legislature you are going to find in the United States and I don't think there is anybody who would question that. Yet, more than maybe any other Legislature in the United States, we seem obsessed with flagellating ourselves, with questioning this or that, not respecting what the public said when they sent Joe or Tom down here or took Bill or Tom out, but trying to find some reason why we need a new law to regulate us a little more tightly. We have our constitutional limitations. We have our criminal statutes. We have our public exposure in the press constantly. We have all the laws in the books but now we need another special "code of conduct" that adds additional ambiguity, but more than that it adds additional potential for mischief and potential to hurt and I am going to use an example because I think it is irresponsible for me to propose a code or anybody else to propose a code where
