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should have no criminal code? You would never suggest that. The Commission on Judicial Qualifications, that doesn't make judges clean completely either, but would you suggest that we do not have that? Judges are elected. Maybe we should just rely upon the public to elect them and yet it was a whole number of members of this body who went to the Commission on Judicial Qualifications and wanted it to be involved and wanted it to act on judges a couple of short years ago when we had a lot of problems. You see, we're applying one standard over here and we won't apply the same standard to ourselves.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The likelihood of abuse of this kind of a mechanism is nonexistent in my opinion. I don't think it will be abused for personal reasons. I don't think it will be abused to shut up a minority because the House of Representatives has had this mechanism for some time and have you noticed that there has been abuse in the House of Representatives? It doesn't happen. It doesn't happen because we need each other; we need our votes; no friction is going to be created because of that fact. The problem has always been the opposite, that bodies will not discipline themselves. That has always been the reality and the problem out there, not they overdiscipline themselves, and for people to stand up here and suggest that somehow there is going to be a whole bunch of things filed and we're all going to be filing things against each other is ludicrous. It is ludicrous, it's a scare tactic, it doesn't relate to reality and it hides and obfuscates the real reality which is that we usually don't come to grips with our own problems.

PRESIDENT: Your time is expiring.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. That concludes the debate on this proposal to change the rules by adoption of Sections 1, 2, and 3 in the material before you. The question then is the adoption of this part of the divided question. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Record vote.
