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peddle themselves, sell themselves out there to the public, sell their morals or lack thereof, rather than a program to worry about everybody else's. This Legislature, as I say, by any standard you want to use, is probably as clean as any in the United States, and somehow the cleaner you are the more obsessed some people seem with watching everybody else's conduct. Identify specific conduct, one, two, three, four, five,...

PRESIDENT: Thirty seconds.

SENATOR DECAMP: ...not an editorial, or an article that a Gabriella wrote who has been here, what, a week and probably not a complete expert yet on the entire Legislature, not an article that says somebody got some food and drink as a big surprise. My goodness, somebody bought somebody a drink. I probably will buy her a drink before the session is over but I don't think it is worth a headline. No, no drink for Gabriella. Well, anyway, the point is it is campaign time I realize but it is time to bring this to a halt. I think we ought to vote this mess up or down. We have criminal laws. We have got all kinds of laws about conduct of a senator.

PRESIDENT: Time has expired.

SENATOR DECAMP: We have got an election and that is the real ultimate judge and I think that is what it should be left to.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator. The Chair would advise the members that under the new speaking system we cannot control the volume up here, and perhaps those of you with strong voices can afford now to stand a little farther away from the microphone and will still be effective. The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, Senator DeCamp brought up the Constitution and that is appropriate whenever we discuss something in the Legislature related to a right or privilege. When I was upstairs I heard a kind of quaver in Senator Goodrich's voice that caused me to scurry down here because I thought the Republic was about to fall and then I found out they were just talking about how much they can eat and drink off somebody. Then I thought maybe I was right about the Republic falling because Senator DeCamp dragged in the
