speech. The law is not vague. It is quite clear. Let me just make two points again, three points. First of all, the only thing you are doing is making the current law with respect to nonfood items the same for food items, \$25 for one month. Tell me logically what is the difference between food and a bowling ball, or a briefcase, or whatever. The law should be the same for all of them, for all these different items. Secondly, and this point hasn't been made and it should have been made a dozen times. We now collect our expenses. We now are reimbursed for our food and for our lodging. How do you expect the public out there to understand that they are paying us for food and at the same time some of us are eating most of our meals for free? That makes no sense whatsoever. They are never going to understand that and they shouldn't understand it because it is not right. It is not right. It is also not right that they pay us so little but those are separate questions. Those I think are the points that I want to make but I have talked before about our public image and surely, surely there is not one person in here that doesn't believe...surely we all believe that these wining and dining headlines hurt the institution. I cannot believe that somebody could tell me to my face that that image is not destructive to the institution. This is not a campaign matter. This has been an issue of mine from year one. It was up before you last year before you funneled it off to the Rules Committee. It is a lasting thing and it will be back here every year that I am here. I don't think there is anybody that cares more about the institution than I do. I really don't. And it is because I care about the institution that I bring this to you, and whether I am Governor next year, or whether I am John Private Citizen next year, someday I am going to find my way back to this institution and I want to be here again because I do care about it. It is a great institution and we can make it a lot better. We can make it the best in the nation. We are positioned to be the best in the nation, and if we can keep doing some little things to make us more independent, such as we have done with our staff, we have done in a whole number of ways in recent years. We have made ourselves more independent and stronger and I know it is hard to change old habits. They are always hard to change. We can't figure out how it is not going to be embarrassing when you have to ask about the cost of the meal. Well, you won't have to ask about the cost of the meal because new assumptions will be made. The assumption will be that you don't buy these guys
