So there are important issues dealt with by way of resolution. So what I am asking is that we take the language that already exists in the rules relative to how resolutions are to be handled and apply that language to all resolutions. The public hearing would still be required for a proposed amendment to the Constitution but it would only take 25 votes to revive it, allow the Legislature to discuss it, and see whether it should be submitted to the public, rather than 30 votes.

PRESIDENT: The motion is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the proposed rule and 25 votes are required for the adoption of this amendment. Under the circumstances, we will have to proceed by way of a roll call vote. Call the roll, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken.)

PRESIDENT: We are voting on the Chambers amendment. A call of the house has been requested. All those in favor of having the house come under call vote aye, opposed vote nay. Vote aye or nay on the call of the house. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The house is under call. All members are required to be in your seats during the time the house is under call. Members of the Legislature outside the Chamber, please return to the Legislative Chamber to indicate your presence for the arrival of the fullest possible quorum. The house is under call. Members are properly to be in your seats during the time the house is under call and the question pending is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the proposed rule. Members may still indicate their vote to the Clerk. Senator Haberman, could we have your green light, please. Senator Wesely, Senator Pirsch. Senator Labedz, would you push your green light on, please. Senator DeCamp, please. All members of the Legislature throughout the building, please report to the Chamber. The house is under call. The question pending and the vote has not been taken yet, members may indicate your vote aye or nay to the Clerk on the proposed Chambers amendment to the resolution on the rule change under discussion.
