the same number of votes that it now takes to bring a bill from a committee once it has been indefinitely postponed. This would harmonize the provisions and require 30 votes in both instances and I am hoping that you will support this change in our rules so that it is clear for everyone. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The proposal is as it has been explained. All those in favor of the rule change vote aye, opposed vote nay and we have to vote by roll call vote. Quiet in the Chamber, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken.)

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: (Mike off) vote is announced.

PRESIDENT: A call of the house has been requested. All those in favor of the house coming under call vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The house is under call. Again, all members are required to be in your seats during the time the house is under call. Members outside the Chamber, please return, the house is under call. The vote being taken is on the adoption of the rule change proposed by Senator Morehead. You may indicate your vote to the Clerk.
