SPEAKER NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So maybe what these editors and these other people who don't understand ought to ask themselves is why are these people who don't get paid much willing to do this much work. It is because people perceive their role in the Legislature differently than it is perceived by editors, generalists, and the public which has never been very well informed on anything. We have an obligation to perceive and understand what our job is and to do it in disregard of all of the temporary rises and falls in public opinion with reference to what we do. Not only would I like to see no limit on the introduction of bills, I would like to see an eradication of the limitation on the days when bills can be introduced. That is how open I want it to be. I think you should be able to introduce a bill right up to the day that we adjourn even if there is no chance for it to be heard. These artificial restrictions are inhibiting what it is we are to do as a Legislature without improving efficiency. You are not imposing an IQ test. You are not examining the bills to make sure that they meet any standard of excellence. You are not determining the issues which can be considered. You are dealing only with numbers, and when you deal like that, you are dealing with form and not substance. So as I oppose the other limitation, I am opposed to this one also but, Senator Johnson, well, never mind.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman, please, then Senator Barrett.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, if you want to be realistic about it, I don't think three days are going to make that much difference. Secondly, some of us aren't blessed with a staff of four so we can get legislation researched and get the information to get a bill drafted, because when I research, we write letters and sometimes the agencies and/or whoever you are writing to take a long time to answer and you have to get on the phone to kind of push them a little bit.
