SPEAKER NICHOL: The old list that I have is, Senator Hefner, did you wish to talk to this? Senator Lamb, to this DeCamp amendment?

SENATOR LAMB: Well, Mr. President, members, I really wanted to ask Senator Johnson a question. Does this include Section 1 where it just applies to this one session or not?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: You know when I gave the Clerk the figures I didn't give the Clerk Section 1 but I think it should have Section 1 in it. Is there a problem if I do it as 1, 3, 4, and 5?

SPEAKER NICHOL: It was my understanding it did include that but then I don't know if the record is straight. Mr. Clerk, could you straighten us out on that?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I would like for it to include it, 1, 3, 4, and 5.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We will proceed on the basis then that it does include just 1986 and no more. Senator Chambers, did you wish to speak to the DeCamp amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, and there is another issue that I am going to leave alone. Senator Johnson, you know, an idle mind is the devil's workshop they often say.
