SPEAKER NICHOL: All right, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. You may look up to see if your light is lit. We are voting to go under call. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please return to your seats. Unauthorized personnel please leave the sanctuary. Please record your presence. Did you want a roll call vote, Senator Harris, or call in votes, or what? Senator Haberman asked for a roll call. Okay. So please record your presence, ladies and gentlemen. Senator Higgins, did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, is it too late to ask for a point of clarification on this bill?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Can you step back and ask Senator Harris about it while we are recording our presence? Would that be all right? Please record your presence. There are a couple here who have not recorded their presence. We are looking for Senator Labedz, Senator Landis, Senator DeCamp, Senator Vickers, Senator Dick Peterson. We are looking for Senator DeCamp and Senator Richard Peterson, please. We saw you.
