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that implementing a change like this is not going to be easy because, first of all, we all resist change. The committee structure has not had a significant look since its adaptation or inception in the 1930s. We've done it piecemeal, according to the power that existed within the legislative body at that time. I would suggest to you that this is an opportune time. Anything that you vote on would not be implemented until the next legislative session, nothing would change this year. So it is a forward look into the future as work loads and areas of concern are before us. Please give this careful consideration before Monday and look at the other options that you have before you, discuss it and come back prepared to discuss it more thoroughly on Monday. I don't know if Senator Beutler, as Chairman of the Executive Board, would care to make any comments in relation to this or not since it was a dual study this summer.

PRESIDENT: Do you wish to yield to him, Senator? Senator Rupp has his light on. Senator Rupp.

SENATOR RUPP: Mr. President, just point of clarification, Senator Morehead, if you would. This is kind of the same circumstance we were at last night. If we are going to vote Monday, we are not going to debate it today, is that correct?

SENATOR MOREHEAD: No, everything will be debated on Monday.

SENATOR RUPP: Okay. We are just going to pass over it in essence.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Yes.

SENATOR RUPP: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. First of all, I've got so much junk here in the last week or two on this I don't have anything that says Format I, II, III, and IV. I've got Format I, I, II, II, and Senator Morehead, I wanted to ask you, what did you say about the Executive Board on this particular rule change?

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I'll take your first question. Format I,
