II, III, and IV were mailed to your office and then later you received another communication which was just Format I and II. I have reproduced Format II and it is on your desk now. So your office should have the other two options. I can help you with that too afterwards. This Format II, or whichever one the body would choose to adopt, would actually be implemented by the Executive Board as an administrative type of implementation, but with the concurrence, I'm sure, and vote of the total legislative body since it is so significant a change. But the actual rule change is not this. The actual rule change is as it appears on page 212.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you. One last question. You mentioned that several senators got together and decided on some of these things.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Oh, no. This morning, after the Executive Board meeting, as we were walking out we were talking to Speaker Nichol about the time and how much time people wanted to give to this today, since we are going to be adjourning at noon, and we just thought that for a thorough debate that it would be better to hold it until Monday so no one felt pressured. And we felt that maybe everybody had not had a thorough chance to look at this and discuss it. We wanted to give everyone plenty of time to think about it and discuss it.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay. I just want to get all of the copies.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Okay.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I don't have it on my desk if they handed it out.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: We'll be sure that you get that.

SENATOR HIGGINS: And I don't have it in my office, you know how the U.S. Postal System is. (Laughter.) Thank you.

SENATOR MOREHEAD: Right. One other thing I'd like to point out to you, on Format...
