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that understanding and then we're going to get back Monday with that committee rules change thing, Emil, and if there is any problem with it we'll change it at that time, if that's okay? Yes, I know what you're saying. I don't want to screw it up, so...yeah, let's just go ahead with it now and then we'll see what the stationery thing and all that will amount to and we can always change that.

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. I think Senator Beyer brought up an excellent point there and I just wanted to mention, at the time that we changed it to Department of Social Services, Gina Dunning said that she would not change the stationery until they ran out of the old stationery and, in fact, she did not because it would have been costly. So I think Senator Beyer has an excellent idea. When the old stationery is used up, then you can come out with the new stationery. As far as the name change, it would be immediately. It would be referred to as that committee in our own announcements, but I certainly wouldn't want to see the state go to any extra expense for this change. And the original purpose for changing the name was because in the statutes there never was a reference to a Department of Welfare. The index of the statutes said, see Social Services. So that's how it came about. I cleaned up the statute and the department was changed then. So I would urge you to adopt this amendment or bill of Senator Wesely's.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, a question of Senator Wesely, please.

PRESIDENT: He is available.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Don, I'm not fighting the change. My only thought and concern is, when we publish and we send out notices of public hearings, if the name is changed, are there going to be some members of the public that not understand the name change so soon and quick? Public Health and Welfare they can pretty well identify now to those three, but if we change it to Human Services they may not identify and somebody may...you know, because it takes time for people to absorb things like this, so would you change
