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also give us a preliminary indication of the kinds of things that we probably ought to be considering in terms of what we ought to introduce and what we wouldn't be introducing. So, with that, it's just a minor change that we could adopt for this 60 day session, and if it works well, possibly we could work it into the permanent rules. Currently it is only for this 1986 legislative year. So with that I urge the adoption to give us that kind of a standard to go by and possibly it will somewhat appease many of you who have concerns, but without restricting us directly in any particular manner other than the time, rather than the bills.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, might as well not stop now, might as well keep on going, Senator Conway. Don't? We've already voted down rule after rule after rule after rule after rule to restrict this body and we have a five day notice that is going to come into effect on hearings. If a bill should be scheduled within this and it's important, we're going to have a lot of explanation to do, and again I say, the system is working, it's working fine, let's don't change it now because of the bills that will be introduced, maybe some of them wouldn't have been or some more and we're compacting ourselves, we're getting in a box. So I would suggest let's just go ahead and defeat this out of all respect to Senator Conway, like we defeated all the rest of them and move on to the revisor's bills we have on the schedule. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner. Senator Warner, do you want to speak on the...Senator Conway's proposal?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I was just going to comment that it may be more appropriate to allow, through the Speaker's chairmen's meeting and see the number of bills, what the flow is. Our tentative schedule right now is for public hearings to be completed by the 24th which would be the thirtieth day but we also have allowed the balance of that week for the committee work to finalize the budget. And as I have said before, we would work within whatever framework the Legislature decides, but it would still seem to me it would be easier to allow that to be more of an administrative decision as the work load is better known and as chairmen
