PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Chambers, continuing saga here, Senator Goodrich has left for Omaha, but left instructions that he did not want to be excused so here's your chance.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, Mr. Chairman, to show that I will never behave in a vindictive fashion, I'm not going to hold us all here while we pursue Senator Goodrich.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. We will proceed with the roll call vote on the Chambers amendment to the Hannibal proposal. May we have order in the Chamber, please, while the Clerk calls the roll, please. (Gavel.) Order in the Chamber while the Clerk calls the roll. Please vote aye or nay on the Chambers amendment.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on page 231 of the Legislative Journal.) 8 ayes, 27 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. The Chair recognizes Senator Hannibal.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. President, members, I think there's an awful lot of ambiguity in the rule there, however, it appears to me that I'm not fully cognizant exactly what the ramifications are and I believe that rather than try and debate this and its pros and cons and I think it would be in my better interest and the interest of the house right now to withdraw this motion for now, at least. And before I formally do that, I do want to make only one mention that I believe that Senator Chambers saw me pass him twice. I was surprised he even remembered it because I think he was reading either the newspaper or most of his mail while he was driving back that day. With that I will withdraw my amendment.
