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whole effort will disintegrate because all of us have to make sacrifices when there is a big change like this. There are always little changes that don't make everybody happy. There are parts of the plan that don't make me happy but overall, overall, I believe that what is being suggested to you is going to be truly of great benefit to the Legislature. We need to readjust our work loads. When one committee, when one two-day committee has 70 or 80 percent more of a work load than another two-day committee, and when there are similar discrepancies like that all over the place, then you have a system that is seriously out of kilter, seriously out of kilter, and we need to take a look at it, we need to make some changes. Please keep in mind that in adopting this rule change, in adopting the rule change and voting right now, as a practical matter, you are only doing two things. You are getting rid of a Constitutional Revision Committee and you are creating a Transportation Committee. That is all that you are effectively doing with this rule change. If the rule change is adopted, then you will enter into a process with the Executive Board and with Senator Chronister and the Committee on Committees for developing a format to implement these changes.

SENATOR LAMB: Thirty seconds, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And you will have an opportunity once again to get input on the number of days that different committees meet, and when they meet, and what their jurisdiction will be. That will be a continuing dialogue in this body for the next year as it should be. But all the things...many of the things that have been talked about today aren't necessarily going to happen if you vote for this rule change today. Format II is a suggestion to you, a starting point to you, given to you by the Exec Board and the Rules Committee acting jointly.

SENATOR LAMB: Your time is up, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would ask your support of the rule change.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is the adoption of the rules change as presented by Senator Morehead. Those in support vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk. Senator Morehead.
