are merely cleaning up obsolete language in the law or will any of them change any of the present laws in any way?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Higgins, to the best of my knowledge and the intent of this whole operation is to simply eliminate obsolete and technical provisions. They in no way are intended nor should they, being referenced directly to the floor, of course, affect the substantive law in any area.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Beutler on 735.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, 735 relates to a section that was passed in 1957 which provided for a one-year statute of limitations on certain types of legal actions. The actions were to have been commenced within one year of June 5, 1957. That limitation has long since passed and the section is no longer pertinent. I would move that the bill be advanced.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is the advancement of LB 735. Those in support vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 735, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: The bill is advanced. LB 736.

CLERK: 736 by Senator Beutler as Chairman of the Board. (Read title.)

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: As the Clerk mentioned, Mr. Speaker, the act terminated December 31, 1985, and there appears to be no reason to keep the statutes on the books. I move the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is the adoption of LB 736. Those in support vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 736, Mr. President.
