

antagonists, whichever. How much time do I have, Mr. Chairman, because I don't want to go over it? Okay. Well, I can't say it all now so I will concede that one minute and then turn my light on.

PRESIDENT: Is there anyone else that wishes to speak? Do you wish to speak a second time, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Mr. Chairman, this all does fall into the same...along the line of what we are talking about here because Martin Luther King has been like a lightning rod and there have a lot of attitudes expressed by various white groups who don't think he should have been recognized. But Senator DeCamp raised an interesting point when he said that I ought to be condemned in that resolution too and based on the attitude of the senators, I don't see how they can do otherwise. But here is what is interesting, and, Senator Beutler, who drafted that letter, knows it. When you begin itemizing things, whatever you don't itemize is not to be covered. So whatever you did not specifically disapprove of, you approved of. So let me show you some of the things that you approved of in that letter that I said. The only reason that America is opposed to Colonel Khadafy in Africa is because he is not a bootlicker for white people. You agree with that. I refer to your President as a "superannuated, Rambo-esque caricature in the last stages of senility." You agreed with that. I said that Israel has caused America to do all kinds of stupid things against the interests of this country. You agreed with that. I referred to things that Reagan had done with his "stupid, ignorant, arrogant, racist self." You agreed with that. I referred to the Legislature as a white person's assembly dedicated to the interests of white people. You agreed with that. And on and on, so having conceded so much to me, I think I would probably be ungracious not to allow you to disagree with the notion that America is a bastion of racism despite the fact that Senator Chizek, who signed that letter, said that there are so many hate groups based on white supremacy growing up not only in this country but in this state, he has offered special legislation to deal with them. Just a few days ago we were reading about a case in Philadelphia where some black people had moved into white neighborhoods and they were being set upon and harassed by hundreds of neighbors and it was so bad the mayor of Philadelphia had to declare a state of emergency. Then after one of the couples was forced from their homes, some
