sure that coverage is for an individual in whatever business capacity they may be, a sole proprietorship, a partner, or the like. For that reason, I would have urged the adoption of this simple and technical amendment to 548 and then we can advance the bill to the next stage of debate.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Landis's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Beutler, it is a revisor bill, isn't it? Oh, Senator Landis's bill. Senator Landis, do you want to move? Move it is to be advanced to Enrollment & Review. Is there discussion? If not, the motion is to advance the bill to General File...from General File to E & R. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on the motion to advance LB 548. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. Next...take up LB 212.

CLERK: Mr. President, 212 was a bill introduced by Senator Warner. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 15 of last year. It was referred to the Appropriations Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are Appropriations Committee amendments pending.
