

Nichol's position that the Marsh amendment is not germane. LB 593 deals with protecting life and health insurance policyholders in Nebraska in the event a company goes under. And as I understand the Marsh amendment, it deals with the Nebraska Association of Nurse Anesthetists who want to be entitled to a direct reimbursement for their claims and their compensation by the insurer, by the insurance company as opposed to receiving their compensation through the hospital as is now the case. I don't think these things have anything in common. They tend to accomplish two different things. So I would urge the Chair to rule the amendment not germane. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further comment on germaneness? Rebuttal, Senator Marsh? The Chair would rule that the amendment is not germane. Although it is included in the same Chapter, I believe that the matter proposed by the Marsh amendment is an entirely different subject and under the Constitution the bill must contain only one subject matter. One refers to general guaranty protection for certain kinds of insurance companies and the other refers to a licensure which is included under the same chapter but is not germane in subject matter. Is there further amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator DeCamp.

PRESIDENT: The DeCamp amendment, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DEKAMP: Mr. President, I am going to...well, not withdraw, I'll put the amendment over until Select File. We have some meetings going on on it. This is rather a big issue, this whole guaranty fund and I would like to withdraw...I have got two amendments and I would like to withdraw them and put them back in place for Select.

PRESIDENT: Very well.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Marsh, you had a second amendment, Senator, on page 2010 from last year.

SENATOR MARSH: I ask to withdraw it at this time.

PRESIDENT: Motion is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, I am back to Senator Chambers
