PRESIDENT: Well, not really. I asked you, given you an opportunity.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, I oppose the Warner amendment because, yes, we started out and it is maybe...basically started out as a sugar beet bill and it is. However, we are now stockpiling corn.

PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Warner, I am going to...

SENATOR HABERMAN: And if we adopt the Warner amendment, that is going to hurt the farmer who has been ordered by the banks to stockpile the corn on his property. He won't be able to move it under an overweight permit. So I would like to ask you to defeat the Warner amendment, move the bill to Select File. Then I am sure that Senator Beyer and I and Senator Warner can sit down and work this thing out. So that is what I had to say, Mr. President, thank you.

PRESIDENT: I inadvertently opened it up for debate again. Senator Warner, you have another opportunity to close.

SENATOR WARNER: Well, Mr. President, I would just urge the body to adopt the amendment. It makes a bad bill not quite as bad.

PRESIDENT: Very well, the motion is to adopt the Warner amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Haberman. Call of the house has been...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: A call of the house been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried. The house is under call. Members, please record your presence. Look up to the front of the Chamber, members, and see that your green light is on.
