

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: No, it's not. The amendment is what you have in your hand.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, I guess I have a little apprehension about adopting an amendment here which is six pages without really having time to see what it does. Let me just express some concerns that I see immediately. This is to strike Section 6, it says on the first line. Okay, then it goes into Section 4. Now what do we do with the original section. Is Section 4 also stricken? Or is Section 4, Section 7, Section 10 included in this new amendment, so I'm wondering, does that mean that we strike those sections in the original bill or are they additions or how does that work?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Senator Lamb, I can't answer that right off the top of my head right now, but I'll check on it for you before...

SENATOR LAMB: Well, I think before we adopt the amendment we need to have some corrections made because as I read it, it is not properly drafted because it says, strike the original Section 6 and insert the following new sections which consist of Section 4, Section 7 and Section 10. So I don't know what we do with the original Section 6 and I don't know what happens also to the original Sections 4, 7 and 10.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: It is my understanding Senator Vickers' office was instrumental in drafting it. He could better respond.

SENATOR LAMB: So he can take the blame?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Well, blame or praise I guess.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb, I see Senator Vickers wishes to respond. Would this be all right with you?

SENATOR LAMB: Certainly.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vickers.
