

of you that because of...I think you're going to see many instances of this where the committee amendments or amendments filed are going to have to be redrafted mainly because of dates that were originally put in a year ago plus the fact that in the meantime the federal government, you know Congress, in spite of the fact that we think we work the year round almost last year, Congress really did work the year round. Whether they accomplished a whole lot or not is debatable, but the fact is EPA did make some changes in their regulations and we had to reflect those with the committee amendments that we had filed. That is the major reason that these were redrafted. Now, I apologize to Senator Lamb and others if it's not...if it comes as a surprise to you to find a memo laying on your desk, but all I can tell you is you'd better get used to it because I think you're going to see a lot of it. I can refer back to the committee amendments and tell you that the intent is the same as the committee amendment, but we had to make some changes in the language. If you agree with the concept, if you agree with the concept that a gallon of gas in your water supply is a gallon of gas in your water supply, it doesn't make any difference what size of tank it comes from or how the operation of that tank is...
