

SENATOR PIRSCH: Oh, okay, well, I was looking earlier and it did set some amounts pursuant to law but that will be set aside then by the rule.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Right. They are all within the Supreme Court's personnel system which will be governed by rule by the Supreme Court.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR MARSH: I call on Senator Hoagland to close.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Madam Chairman, closing on the amendment, Amendment 1732, a white copy of which and a summary of which has been distributed, that amendment standardizes several procedural matters pertaining to the court system. Appeals to the Supreme Court from all courts will change from one month to 30 days. The venue requirements for defendants are simplified, unnecessary language is deleted and other technical changes are made. The amendments also change the appeal time of the workmen's compensation court from one month to 30 days, requires that the county court appeal procedures follow Supreme Court rules prescribed for district court appeals, makes that and other changes that are set out in the handouts. Again this is an amendment of a technical nature that will enable the judicial process to work better. We would like to use LB 529 as a vehicle for that. I would ask your adoption of this amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: We are ready and will now vote on the amendment to LB 529. Have you all voted?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Madam President, we have six more votes that we need to adopt this amendment without a call of the house and, of course, I hesitate to call everyone in for purposes of adopting this amendment.

SENATOR MARSH: The clerk will record.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would ask to accept call in votes, Madam President, for a minute or two.

SENATOR MARSH: I think you have to request we go under call first in order to accept call in votes.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: All right, I ask that we go under call.
