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I mentioned the other day, it is going to take maybe a chairman or a group of people in that committee willing to dedicate themselves to saying, okay, these bills are important enough that we should be directing our time to these issues, and maybe letting some of the more frivolous, minor legislative issues go. That is a difficult thing to do because who is going to set the rules of the game, so to speak, on what bills are important which ones are not. But in this particular case I think the committee has done a pretty good job of addressing environment concerns and balancing those out with agricultural concerns as well. As I said the other day as well, we still have a problem in the referencing of bills and the politics that goes along with referencing of bills and I don't think, under any committee structure, you are going to be able to change that. There are still going to be bills that people will want to have in their particular committees as opposed to someone else's committee. I don't sit on the Referencing Committee or the Executive Board, so I'm not criticizing those people, but I think it is a natural feeling or intuition to say let me keep this bill, it's important to me, and do the very best to get it over into my committee. A good example of things that have been happening, we've had referencing fights on this floor. As Chairman of the Ag and Environment Committee there is a sort of a quasi, undefined area as far as where environment issues belong, where water issues belong. Since I've been chairman I guess I felt somewhat like the bad guy in this whole thing because I've had to take battles out here on the floor on where what I think are water quality bills should be referenced. Maybe this new committee structure will alleviate that, but I don't know if you can honestly say that in every particular case, not just in the area of the environment or water quality, that you are going to see politics taken out of the referencing of particular issues. So, Mr. President, with that I will conclude my comments at this particular time and listen to the comments of others. As I said, I think this issue is significant enough and important enough that this Legislature should seriously give this matter a second look, maybe a little bit more in depth consideration than we gave it on a Monday morning because, let's face it, it doesn't just impact the chairmen of the committees that are going to be eliminated or changed. It is not going to impact just those people who are going to see some of their power base enhanced or disintegrated. I think it is going to impact every one of us in this body in some way,...
