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that committee does. The gatekeeper for the Constitution of the State of Nebraska and maybe, maybe that could end up being the most important committee because one little constitutional change can have ten times as many ramifications as all the laws we pass in a single year, witness Initiative 300, or witness the fact that legislators salary is locked in the Constitution, or witness the gambling, all controlled ultimately by that Constitution. So bottom line I guess is, was the problem the structure of the committees, in other words was the problem the entire car, or was the problem something malfunctioning in the engine that needs to be tuned up?

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR DECAMP: I think there is a fair case to be made that the malfunctioning, if indeed it exists, is more internal and needs to be corrected there, through whatever means are appropriate, and not the entire system. When you yield to changing the entire system, for internal malfunctions, you end up with new personnel, expansion of government and the potential that the next time there is a malfunction, internally, you simply restructure again rather than deal with the real problem. So I guess I think it makes sense to at least reconsider, which is all this vote is for, and see if maybe you can't correct whatever problems you perceived existed by simply internally in the committees working on that level rather than redoing the whole structure.

PRESIDENT: Motion is the motion to reconsider that has been under discussion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Excuse me, my controls are...you are voting on the motion to reconsider that has been under discussion. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 18 nays on adoption of the motion to reconsider the adoption of permanent rules, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carried. Now we go into the other motion, reconsideration of the committee restructuring. Senator DeCamp, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, you've heard the arguments. I don't know how much more debate, I suppose we can rebuttal
